Like pages from a shared book, these pieces should draw viewers in, encouraging close study as their quiet stories unfold in detailed form.

The National Association of Women Artists (NAWA), founded in 1889, stands as the first professional women's organization established in the United States.

Five pioneering women sought to address the lack of opportunities for women artists. Anita C. Ashley, Adele Francis Bedell, Elizabeth S. Cheever, Grace Fitz-Randolph, and Edith Mitchill Prellwitz spearheaded a vital alternative to the restrictions of the day, providing a supportive network and avenues for exhibition.
